NAG5 - School Environment

6.00pm: Welcome to Melanie Martin to introduce PB4L

- Melanie introduced herself she is a school wide practitioner job here is to explain what PB4L is ... being positive and proactive
- PB4L has been passed as a nation-wide education programme that all schools in NZ participate in.
- What does a PB4L School-Wide school look like? Melanie explained this to the BOT:
 - The school environment is positive and supportive
 - Expectations are constantly clear
 - Students are consistently taught desired behaviours
 - Students are consistently acknowledged for desired behaviours and responded to in a fair and equitable way
- A continuum of support that meets the needs of all students is available
- Russell School has some grounding in PB4L but we are starting afresh again.
- 2021 Russell School will focus in Tier 1
- Russell School has been given funding to help the school set up PB4L over the next few years.
- Everything done in this programme is evidence based. All behaviour has a purpose ... a child is generally trying access something or get attention. Teachers get training in functional behaviour strategies within the environment.

 Eveleen only staff member in school currently that was involved in PB4L training in previous years.
